

Direct Service: Therapy Provision

Direct Service Hours

Time spent engaging in evidence-based therapeutic services with individuals, couples, families, and groups.

At Atlas, clinicians see clients across the lifespan.

Supervision & Training

Each week the Fellow will receive at a minimum: two hours of individual supervision, one hour of group supervision, and one hour of didactic training.

Administration & Development

Administrative time includes documentation and care coordination.

Professional development time is to be used at the Fellow's discretion (i.e., outside training and studying for licensure).

Compensation:


- salaried position (paid twice each month)

Our physical office is in the East Humboldt Park area of Chicago. This is west of the Loop (downtown).

Fellows will be asked to come into the office at least 2 days each week. The remainder of their time can be in the office or working from home.



Goodness of Fit:

Atlas is seeking a clinician who is relational, open, curious, self-aware, fun, and social justice-minded. We are looking for someone who is organized, values ongoing learning, and is committed to continuous growth. At Atlas, we believe that valuing learning and growth involves frequent, reciprocal feedback rooted in honesty and mutual respect. Clinicians likely to excel at Atlas are those who process and use the therapeutic relationship in their work intentionally and appreciate spaces to continue exploring this aspect of their clinical work.

Additionally, clinicians who recognize the importance of developing a conscious self-awareness of one's positionality and consistently interrogating how their positionality may impact and/or inform clinical practice would be a good fit at Atlas. Clinicians who hold notable privilege are especially expected to be actively engaged in anti-racist, LGBTQ-affirming, and generally anti-oppressive practice, with the recognition that this is a lifelong and action-oriented process.



At Atlas:

- We expect Fellows to work towards providing empirically supported treatments through a social justice and anti-oppressive lens by:
 - Evidence-Based Therapeutic Interventions & Documentation (Understand how research/literature can inform treatment)
 - Anti-Oppressive Counseling Practices
 (Understand systemic oppression & barriers to treatment that impact the therapeutic space)
 - Self-Awareness & Interrogation of Personal Positionality (Understand the impact a clinician has on the therapeutic space)
- Fellows will be supervised by Dr. Collins (she/her/hers) and Dr. Hovan (she/her/hers). In addition, Fellows will be supported by Atlas' Clinical Practice Manager, Dafne Paglia (she/her/hers).
- We offer opportunities for all clinicians to provide group therapy, specific to their clinical interests and goals.

Application Requirements:

Prior to your start date, you have completed (or reasonably expect to complete) all doctoral degree requirements from a regionally accredited institution of higher education or APA/CPA-accredited program in Clinical Psychology, Counseling Psychology or School Psychology.

Prior to your start date, you have completed (or reasonably expect to complete) a doctoral internship from an APA/CPA-accredited program or an internship that meets all APPIC standards*.

*For applicants from non-APA/CPA-accredited internships, to ensure the internship meets APPIC standards, applicants are additionally required to submit a detailed description of the structure and content of their internship.
